BLUE is devoted to the legacy of Benny Goodman and features a series of recordings exclusive to T©B and never before released.


YELLOW is the "new groove" in music today.

It must have been 1988 when I first met Diana Krall. I had been out of music for awhile and away from Switzerland. After returning to Zurich I began driving a taxi part time – a secondary profession not unknown to jazz musicians– in order to tide me over while reestablishing my contacts in the music scene.

One day while waiting for a fare at one of Zurich's busiest intersections, I noticed an attractive blond woman in her twenties briskly approaching my car. Upon entering she asked in English, with a hint of apology, if I could take her to the Hallenstadion. For those unfamiliar with Zurich, the Hallenstadion is a large stadium used mainly for track and field events. Now, she clearly wasn't on anybody's track team nor did she look like the type to take in a sporting event. After expressing relief at having found a native English-speaking taxi driver, she told me that she was on her way to the opera, outdoor performances of which are sometimes given in the Hallenstadion during fair weather.

On the way there, I learned that she was a singer-pianist working solo for a month in the bar of one of Zurich's most established hotels, the Central. After briefly explaining my own professional involvement in jazz I promised to come by one evening to hear her perform. A few days later I showed up and, needless to say, was very impressed with what I heard or, rather, discovered. Here was a singer of depth

and intensity that was able to convey it all with a breezy, laid-back phrasing -something normally assumed to be contradictory. Moreover, and this was critical to her delivery, Diana had developed a mature and swinging comping style, using good chord voicings and placing accents and fills in the right places.

It wasn't long before the idea came to me that Diana with her particular combination of depth and lightness would be ideal to perform some songs and lyrics that I was putting together at the time. It coincided with fact that I had recently begun playing trombone again and had a working group with guitar and no piano. Therefore, the idea of her singing and playing piano fit well. The guitarist was also a vocalist so it was possible to have vocal harmony on some tunes. Musically it seemed ideal. Diana agreed to join us and returned in December 1989 to do a tour of ten concerts plus this recording.

I subsequently tried to generate interest in the recording among some smaller labels but without success. Due to both the passing of time and my other projects I had virtually given up the idea that it would ever come out. Then last Spring while on tour with a group that included drummer and owner of this label, Peter Schmidlin, the opportunity presented itself to mention the recording.

Peter gave a listen, liked both the music and the performances and decided to bring it out.

Of the seven titles recorded here, Isla Eckinger and Harold Vick composed Detroit Blues and Your Destiny respectively. It should be noted that the short versions of these two titles have been done intentionally for the purpose of radio play. They are neither spliced nor otherwise taken from the long versions but are, rather, completely separate takes.

It should also be mentioned that the solid performances by all concerned are a direct result of the group having played numerous concerts before going into the studio, rather than the other way around as is so often the case. Perhaps most noticeable is the sincerity and passion by which Diana plunges into material that was both new and challenging.
